Uniform must be worn at Wirksworth Junior School at all times to develop a sense of pride in being a member of the whole school community.

Uniform at the school is:

- Plain grey or black trousers (or shorts in warmer weather)
- White shirt or light blue polo shirt decorated with or without school logo.
- Navy blue sweatshirt or cardigan
- Blue gingham style dress, grey pinafore, grey/black trousers or medium length grey skirt
- Sensible hardwearing black shoes, black boots or sandals which can be polished.

Notes on footwear:

In winter, snow boots may be worn to school, however children should change into plain black footwear once indoors.

PE

- Navy blue t-shirt with or without the school logo
- Navy shorts
- Dark trainers.
- Black plimsolls for indoor PE.
- Dark blue/black/grey joggers and tracksuit top.

Forest schools

- School T-shirts and jumpers.
- Old trousers, no jeans.
- Water proofs coat and trousers.
- Walking boots or wellington boots to change into.

Personal appearance code:

- If hair is long enough it should be tied back at all times
- Only small, plain silver or gold studs should be worn in pierced ears.
- Earring must be removed for Forest Schools, PE and swimming.

Please ensure that all items of uniform, PE kit and outdoor clothing (e.g. coats, gloves, etc.) are clearly labelled with your child's name, so that owners can be easily identified if items are misplaced.

School cannot be held responsible for personal property which is not labelled.

Please note:

We understand that physical disabilities, religious reasons or medical conditions may mean a child cannot adhere to the policy. Parents must communicate with the school/class teacher before they send their child to school. Financial reasons may also be a barrier and the school will work alongside these families to signpost for support.
